The award which is signed by Rotary International President DK Lee and District "Rotary International Best Cooperative Projects Award

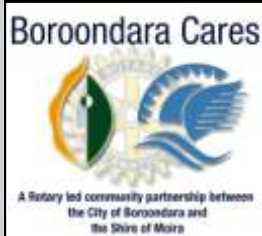

International Service News

AN “UPLIFTING” EXPERIENCE

Donations In Kind (DIK) has been operating in District 9800 for many years now and must have shipped hundreds and hundreds of tones of Goods worth millions of dollars to needy communities around the works – the extent of operation is quite staggering. It is operated by the District but under the auspices of the Rotary Club of West Footscray



This week four of our Members – Mike Pavey, John Steven, Don Fotheringham and John Phillips – answered the call from DIK for help to load a 40 foot container with goods destined for Timor Leste. These goods covered clothing, books, furniture, computers, filing cabinets, - just about anything Rotarian Bill Dagg can scrounge and can be put to good use.

Like all Rotary Projects the work starts slowly and with a lot of Chiefs “going with the flow”, the work inexorably continues and lo and behold it all falls into place and its finished.

DIK is quite an operation, it is housed in several huge warehouse sheds in West Footscray and Bill and a team of Volunteers work there at least two days a week and always

good help (Contact John Phillips if you would like to make up another team some time). There they receive and sort a range of Items, some new, some used, packages are broken down and repacked, computers are refurbished, furniture repaired. (An analogy members might relate to is that it is similar to what Foodbank does with food). Rent for the storage facilities amounts to approximately \$50,000 per year and freight around \$8,000 per container to ship to Timor Leste, so DIK needs the continuing support of all clubs in the District and indeed the Southern Region.



When the call comes in from a disadvantaged community or as part of a specific Project the goods are sorted, collated, palletized and loaded into containers for shipment. This is a real hands on activity that achieves great things, and certainly provided the volunteers from Camberwell with satisfaction, quire a few laughs and tired backs – but well worth it.
