Camp Getaway News

Welcome news has been received from ANZ Trustees advising of a \$52,000 grant to assist with completion works at the Camp Getaway site.

The grant comes from the winding up of Trust activities for the Victorian Disabled Citizens Association and had its genesis from a conversation following one of Ken Maxfield's D9800 guest speaking engagements.

In tandem, the Yooralla organisation will also receive a grant to assist Camp Getaway in moving towards accreditation, and developing recreation programs for campers with a disability.

As discussed at the Camp Getaway Board meeting, they will certainly be utilising a portion of the ANZ funds to progress plans and strategies to replace and upgrade the outdated kitchen at the site.

The plant manager and Rob briefed us as to the do's and don'ts of the factory tour. The size of the factory is extensive and we were shown both the pastry and bread manufacturing plants, both virtually fully automatic.

All who attended were most impressed with the standards which the plant operated under. After the tour of the bakery was completed we were back on the bus and off to the Excelsior Hotel for dinner.

"Majella is a small producer bringing great lustre to the Coonawarra name. The winery was only built in 1995 although a 6-acre vineyard was planted to Shiraz in 1968 and the first Cabernet Sauvignon vines were planted in 1970. The vineyard expanded during the next thirty years and now embraces over 60 hectares of vines most of it planted to Cabernet Sauvignon, Shiraz and Riesling. Majella's first vintage was in 1991 and since then, under the masterful eye of winemaker Bruce Gregory, the brand has established a reputation as a producer of some of Coonawarra's finest wines. With well over 500 Trophies and Medals, including several major International Awards, Majella is regarded as one of Australia's best small wineries.
