### DG COLIN MUIR

District Governor Colin Muir made his first official visit to the Club accompanied by Pauline.



Colin highlighted the achievements and plans of the Club and how they fit into the Aims and objectives of the Current RI president and Theme.

The DG acknowledged the Officers of the Club and the commendable aim of a nett increase in membership of 10 over the year.. He also thanked us for the hosting of the RYLA camp in December.

He outlined the decisions made by RI that until Polio Plus is successful no new major project will be contemplated. However he highlighted some ongoing problems that have to be addressed by the World Community and which Rotary can help.

These included:

**Water** where 1.2 billion people are denied clean water and there is a plan to halve that number by 2015

**Sanitation** 2.6 billion people do not have the privacy which we all take for granted. The use of soap and water would save 1 million people a year.

**Literacy** 800 million can not read and write. A reduction in this number would enable more to get out of poverty.

**Service To Youth** Rotary's aim is to assist youth so that they may participate and contribute.

**Vocational Service** Often the forgotten path of service, but is a cornerstone of Rotary, Ethics are not there to be updated and should be there o lead by example.

He extolled the Club to continue the works in hand and reminded us that "The Future of Rotary is in Our hands"

## A Sobering Tale

### **GARAGE TILT-A-DOORS: SAFETY HAZARD**

Anyone who has a power operated tilt-a-door (not a roller door or sectional door) and hasn't had the springs checked or replaced in the past 10 years might wish to speak to Jim O'Hara about the consequences of when the spring mechanism suddenly fails.

Apparently this is quite common and usually occurs when the door is shut and the metre length spring mechanism is at maximum tension.

In Jim's case a sizeable chunk of one of the fractured springs travelled some 6 metres to the opposite end of the garage at high velocity, leaving a significant indent in the wall at eye height.

Subsequent conversations with numerous industry reps revealed this to be a common occurrence for this type of door at about the 10 year point, with quoted examples of springs or parts thereof penetrating ceilings or smashing through the window of adjacent cars.

Most just shrugged their shoulders at the inherent risk to personnel and property, but Jim found one company that voluntarily fits a "spring retention kit" whenever they install new doors of this type or overhaul existing doors.

Jim can provide the details to anyone interested.
