

Justice For An Anzac

An Interesting Article about another WW1 Grave Submitted BY Geoff Day on his Grandfather, (the article is taken from the Parramatta Advertiser on 26th August)



The Family at The Commemoration Ceremony

PRIVATE Percy Hugh Roy Goodwin, (Grandfather of member Geoff Day) of Auburn (NSW), can finally rest in peace, more than 75 years after his death.

An original Anzac whose diary, records his landing at Gallipoli, Pte Goodwin was gassed and wounded in France and returned home to Auburn as the Armistice was signed on November 11, 1918.

But 13 years after the war, aged 47, Pte Goodwin who had lived in

poor health died in Sydney on December 16, 1931, his family blaming his premature death on the gas. But a bureaucratic nightmare would plague his family for the rest of their lives. as the government of the day refused to accept his death was war-caused.

Various bodies and individuals argued his case and in March 2006 the Department of Veterans' Affairs agreed to accept that Percy's death was indeed war-caused.

A ceremony last Sunday at Rookwood Cemeteries commemorated Pte Goodwin's war grave. "It drew to a close events that ought properly have been dealt with 77 years ago and Percy can truly rest in peace," Mr Day said.

The service was attended by 50 family and friends including Geoff.

Last Meeting

Lambis Engleos ably supported by Tim Whitford provided an enthusiastic address outlining their extensive crusade in bringing to the Government's and the world's attention the fate of "The Missing" Australian and British soldiers killed at the Battle of Fromelle that took place on 19th July 1916.

They outlined the extensive investigations undertaken by Lambis, an amateur historian and head of the "Friends of the 15th Brigade 1st AIF" that proved the location of 175 Australians buried by the Germans in a field outside the village of Fromelle culminating in an on site archaeological dig that confirmed the existence of the mass graves, leading to the Government's subsequent decision to re bury the remains in individual graves. Tim outlined the story of his grand father and others who were killed in the Battle of Fromelle.

A great address described by Chair Les Brown as one of the best we have heard.
